Offensive Player of the Week



Donald McKillop, Middlebury

(Senior, QB - Poway, Calif.)

In his final game for Middlebury, McKillop broke the only Panther passing record he didn't already own as he tossed six touchdowns in a 42-20 victory against Tufts. McKillop went 29-for-41 (.707) for 339 yards with no interceptions, posting an efficiency rating of 188.48. He ends his career having completed 814-of-1,300 passes (.626) for 8,748 yards and 62 touchdown passes over 30 career games.

Defensive Co-Players of the Week



Kevin Helm, Bates

(Junior, ILB - Norwell, Mass.)

Helm recorded a game- and career-high 18 tackles (14 solo), including 2.5 for a loss of six yards, in the Bobcats' 28-18 victory over Hamilton in the season finale. He also broke up a pass in the win. Helm finished the year tied for the team lead in tackles with 80, and his single-game tackle total was the highest for a Bates player in over five years.



Thomas Kilgore, Trinity

(Senior, OLB - San Francisco, Calif.)

Kilgore came up big for the Bantams when it counted the most during Saturday's 27-20 victory at Wesleyan. His seven-yard tackle for a loss deep in the red zone late in the game prevented the Cardinals from taking the lead and forced them to settle for a game-tying field goal. Trinity would go on to score a touchdown on its next drive. Kilgore finished the victory with seven tackles (five solo), 3.5 for a loss of 10 yards, and two sacks for a loss of three yards - his first two sacks of the season.

Special Teams Player of the Week



Nick Campbell, Trinity

(Sophomore, WR - New Albany, Ohio)

Campbell had a blocked punt, a kick return of 37 yards, and a punt return of 34 yards in the Bantams' 27-20 victory at Wesleyan on Saturday. Campbell's blocked punt in the final minute of the first half led to a Trinity touchdown and a 17-14 halftime lead. His 37-yard kickoff return set up a Bantam field goal.

Notes From Week #8

NESCAC

Williams College won the 2010 NESCAC Football title on Saturday with a 31-16 victory at Amherst. The Ephs finished the season at 8-0, the seventh perfect season in program history. Trinity College claimed runner-up honors with a 27-20 win at Wesleyan, as a late touchdown broke a 20-20 tie. The Bantams have finished as runner-up in four of the last five seasons, winning the NESCAC trophy in 2008. It is the third outright title for Williams, with its most recent championship coming in 2006, the Ephs' last perfect season. Four different teams have won the NESCAC title over the past four years: Middlebury in 2007, Trinity in 2008, Amherst in 2009, and now Williams in 2010.

Amherst

Senior wide receiver Brian Murphy (Evanston, Ill.) increased his streak of consecutive games with at least one reception to 24 in Saturday's 31-16 setback to Williams. Quarterback Alex Vetrus (Bellevue, Wash.) tied a single-season program record by finishing the year with 16 touchdown passes. He also increased his streak of consecutive games with at least one touchdown pass to 24 games. Junior P/K Matt Rawson (Bethesda, Md.) set a new single-season program record for field goals with his ninth of the season in Saturday's loss to Williams, as his 27-yard field goal in the first quarter gave the Lord Jeffs a 3-0 lead. Amherst set a program record for scoring offense in a single-season, averaging 35.8 points per game. The previous mark of 34.8 points per game came during the 1957 season.

Bates

Junior WR John Squires (Swampscott, Mass.) caught three passes for 79 yards, including a 63-yard touchdown reception that gave the Bobcats the lead for good in a 28-18 victory over Hamilton. Squires closed out the year with six touchdown receptions, the most for a Bates player since Dylan MacNamara hauled in six touchdown catches in 2005. Senior P/K Gavin Segall-Abrams (Greensboro, N.C.) punted 11 times for a 43.3-yard average, placing six of his kicks inside the Hamilton 20-yard line.

Bowdoin

Junior linebacker Ian Vieira (Plymouth, Mass.) intercepted a third-quarter pass and returned it 17 yards for a touchdown to give the Polar Bears a 26-14 lead in an eventual 26-21 victory at Colby. He also contributed four tackles in the win (three solo). Junior wide receiver Pat Noone (North Attleboro, Mass.) returned the opening kickoff 89 yards for a touchdown, the third-longest return in program history. He also caught eight passes for 112 yards and a touchdown and saw action on defense for the Polar Bears, breaking up a pass on the Mules' final drive.

Colby

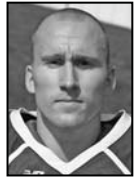
Junior WR Connor Walsh (Westwood, Mass.) tied the program record for receptions in a game with 11 for 141 yards in Saturday's 26-21 setback to Bowdoin. He closed out the year with 55 catches for 532 yards and three touchdowns. Derrick Beasley tied for the team lead in stops with seven (five solo) and also had a pass break-up. Beasley finished the season second among the Mules in tackles (51) and first in interceptions (three).

Hamilton

Senior running back Mark Snickenberger (Wellesley, Mass.) caught seven passes for a career-high 106 yards, including a 30-yard touchdown in the first quarter, during Saturday's 28-18 loss at Bates. Snickenberger entered Saturday's season finale with just 56 receiving yards all year. Sophomore DB Jared Kochenash (Whitehall, Pa.) recovered a muffed punt late in the first half for a touchdown and also recorded his first career interception in Saturday's setback to the Bobcats. Kochenash led a defense that held Bates to just 179 yards, nine first downs, and a 1-of-14 showing on third down. Freshman running back James Stanell (Coopersburg, Pa.) returned a kick 80 yards for a touchdown. It was his team-leading sixth touchdown this season.

Middlebury

Junior Matt Rayner (Andover, Mass.) caught six passes for 111 yards in the Panthers' 42-20 victory over Tufts. Three of his six receptions were for touchdowns. Senior Gary Cooper (Scottsdale, Ariz.) finished his career with his first 100-yard game, rushing for a personal-best 123 yards. Senior DB Connor Green (Wellesley, Mass.) led his team with 12 tackles (11 solo) in Saturday's win. He also broke up three passes, two in the end zone, and intercepted another, his third pick of the year.

Trinity

Sophomore quarterback Ryan Burgess (Dracut, Mass.) completed 17-of-25 passes (.680) for 169 yards and three touchdowns in a 27-20 win at Wesleyan on Saturday. Burgess tossed the game-winning score with 1:02 left in the contest, a 31-yard touchdown down the left sideline.

Tufts

Senior QB Anthony Fucillo (Winthrop, Mass.) broke all of the Jumbos' single-season passing records, as he finished the fall with 215 completions in 419 attempts (.513) for 2,475 yards and 16 touchdowns. The 215 completions are 70 more than the previous record, which was set by Matt Russo in 2007. His 2,475 yards was 836 more than the 1,639 yards that Dave Piermarini put up in 1982. Junior LB Zach Skarzynski (Hinsdale, Ill.) finished Saturday's game at Middlebury with 14 tackles (10 solo) and a fumble recovery.

Wesleyan

Running back Shea Dwyer (Marlborough, Conn.) posted his seventh game of more than 100 rushing yards, more than any previous Cardinal, in Saturday's 27-20 setback to Trinity. Dwyer ended the season with a program-record 1,242 yards, the fourth-highest total in conference history. With 114 yards on 27 carries (4.2 per rush) against Trinity, Dwyer was the only running back to crack the century mark against the Bantams' league-leading rushing defense this year. Junior LB Cyprian Oyomba (Norwalk, Conn.) had a team-leading 11 tackles (four solo) in Saturday's season finale. Oyomba led his squad in tackles with 80, 24 more than the next nearest Cardinal. Freshman kicker Sebastian Aguirre (Denville, N.J.) booted two field goals over 30 yards (2-for-2) and converted both extra point attempts on Saturday. His second field goal of the day, a 31-yard attempt with 1:52 remaining, tied the game at 20. He also averaged 54.0 yards over five kickoffs.

Williams

Senior QB Pat Moffitt (Washington Township, N.J.) completed 75 percent of his passes Saturday (24-of-32) for 326 yards and four touchdowns in the Ephs' 31-16 victory at rival Amherst. The win completed Williams' seventh perfect season in program history, as the Ephs finished 2010 at 8-0. Moffitt also ran for a career-high 51 yards on five carries and also punted once for 30 yards. He also added to the single-season and career touchdown program records which he holds, with a league-leading 25 TD tosses this fall and 45 through his career. Saturday's win was the fourth 300-yard passing game this season, and the fourth time he threw four touchdowns in a single game. Senior MLB Dylan Schultz (Williamstown, Mass.) recorded a team-high 13 tackles (11 solo) and had a sack in the Ephs' victory. Sophomore WR/KR Darren Hartwell (North Reading, Mass.) returned four kickoffs 76 yards (19.0 per return) and two punts 12 yards. He also made seven catches for 116 yards and hauled in a touchdown, extending his single-season record for touchdown receptions to 10 in the process.
