### **McCallum Foote, Middlebury**

(Sophomore, QB - Newton, Mass.)

Foote led the Panthers to a 41-15 win over Colby on Saturday afternoon, tossing four touchdowns and compiling 391 yards through the air. He finished the day completing 27-of-43 passes (.628) with a long of 52 yards, as he found seven different receivers throughout the game. Foote recorded an efficiency rating of 166.18 and was not sacked at all during the victory.

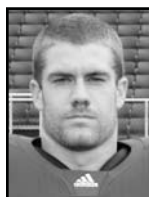


### **Brett McAllister, Bates**

(Senior, OLB - Exeter, N.H.)

McAllister had two interceptions, two sacks for a combined loss of nine yards, two pass break-ups, and five tackles (four solo) during the Bobcats' first win of the year, a 28-9 victory over Tufts on Saturday. McAllister keyed a Bates defensive unit that held Tufts to 18 rushing yards on 25 carries, sacked the quarterback six times, and totaled four interceptions, as the Bobcats were +4 in the turnover department.

## Special Teams Player of the Week



### **Patrick George, Bates**

(Junior, RB - Gloucester, Mass.)

George returned two kickoffs for 55 yards with a long return of 32 yards and helped his Bobcat squad with a two-point conversion late in the second quarter during a 28-9 win against Tufts on Saturday. He also posted a career-high 84 yards rushing on 22 carries (4.2 per carry) with one touchdown.

## Notes From Week #2

**Amherst**

Senior RB Eric Bunker (Topsfield, Mass.) carried the ball 26 times for 134 yards (5.2 per carry) and a two-yard touchdown run that gave the Lord Jeffs a 7-3 advantage in the final minute of the first half during a 20-3 victory over Bowdoin on Saturday. Amherst held a 199-74 advantage on the ground in wet conditions. Bunker has run for a touchdown in each of his past three games dating back to last season. The Amherst defense intercepted three Bowdoin passes and held the Polar Bears to only 68 second half yards. Senior Kevin Heller returned an interception 28 yards to the Bowdoin four-yard line in the opening minute of the fourth quarter, resulting in a touchdown on the first play of the ensuing drive. Junior ILB Sam Clark (Andover, Mass.) led all players with 11 tackles (five solo), while senior DL Kevin Ferber (Mahwah, N.J.) had seven solo tackles (nine total) and a sack for a loss of 10 yards. Senior P/K Matt Rawson (Bethesda, Md.) went 2-for-2 on PAT attempts and was 2-for-3 on field goals in the Jeffs' win over the Polar Bears. He accounted for all of Amherst's points in the third quarter, connecting from 20 and 37 yards out to make it a two-possession game heading into the fourth quarter. Rawson also punted six times for an average of 36.0 yards, twice pinning the Polar Bears inside the 20-yard line.

**Bunker****Bates**

Junior QB Trevor Smith (Malvern, Pa.) led his Bobcat squad to a 28-9 victory over Tufts on Saturday, the largest margin of victory for Bates since 2004. He completed 17-of-24 passes (.708) for 122 yards, tossing two touchdowns without any interceptions or sacks. Smith also rushed 22 times for a career-high 83 yards (3.8 per carry) and one touchdown.

**Smith****Bowdoin**

Sophomore running back Zach Donnarumma (Ramsey, N.J.) rushed for 75 yards on 22 carries (3.4 per carry) with a long run of 13 yards during the Polar Bears' 20-3 setback at Amherst on Saturday. Linebacker David Nurse (Waltham, Mass.) led the defense with 10 tackles (nine solo), including a tackle for a loss of a yard, and a pass break-up.

**Colby**

Freshman RB/QB Luke Duncklee (Augusta, Maine) rushed six times for 73 yards (12.2 per carry) and scored on a six-yard touchdown run during Saturday's 41-15 setback at Middlebury. He also returned two kickoffs for 62 yards with a long return of 36 yards. Sophomore linebacker Mike Hyatt (Walpole, Mass.) had a game- and collegiate-high 18 tackles (nine solo) and recovered a fumble during Saturday's game. Hyatt leads the Mules with 26 tackles over the first two outings of the season. Junior kicker David Bendit (Emmaus, Pa.) kicked a 25-yard field goal and had all three of his kickoffs go for touchbacks.

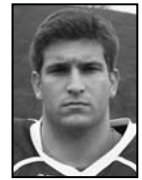
**Hamilton**

Sophomore running back James Stanell (Coopersburg, Pa.) carried the ball 17 times for a total of 75 yards (4.4 per carry) with a long run of 32 yards in the Continentals' 7-6 victory over Wesleyan on Saturday. Stanell also caught two passes for four yards. Junior linebacker

Mike MacDonald (Glen Ridge, N.J.) was credited with a career-high 21 tackles (six solo), including two for a loss of three yards, in Saturday's win. MacDonald led a defensive unit that held the Cardinals to 276 yards of offense. Junior K/P/WR Garrett Hoy (Irvington, N.Y.) punted five times for an average of 39.4 yards, pinning Wesleyan inside the 20 on two occasions. He also averaged 64.0 yards on two kickoffs with one touchback, converted one PAT, and caught two passes for 29 yards. Hamilton is 2-0 for the first time since 1992.

**MacDonald****Middlebury**

Junior linebacker John Wiet (Morristown, N.J.) made 13 tackles (five solo), including a sack for a loss of two yards during the Panthers' 41-15 victory over Colby. The Middlebury offensive line, led by senior lineman Ken LeStrange (Short Hills, N.J.), allowed no sacks and helped account for 553 yards of total offense in the Panthers' win on Saturday.

**LeStrange****Trinity**

Sophomore running back Evan Bunker (Topsfield, Mass.) rushed 30 times for 132 yards (4.4 per carry) and a three-yard touchdown in the Bantams' 21-13 victory over Williams. Senior ILB Walter Fallas (Everett, Mass.) led a Bantam defensive that which held Williams to 24 rushing yards on 27 carries with a team-high 10 tackles (six solo) and a sack. Fallas stopped an Eph ball carrier for no gain on a fourth-and-two play on the Bantam 26-yard line in the third quarter. Sophomore punter Hedley Jennings (Charlotte, N.C.) punted the ball 10 times for an average of 36.6 yards per punt with a long of 49 yards and two downed inside the 20-yard line. Trinity tied Mount Union for the longest home winning streak in the nation, as the Bantams won their 40th in a row.

**Fallas****Tufts**

Senior quarterback Johnny Lindquist (Highland Park, Ill.) threw for over 200 yards for the second time in his career, completing 22-of-39 passes (.564) for 258 yards in a 28-9 setback at Bates on Saturday. Junior Dylan Haas (Yorktown Heights, N.Y.) caught eight passes for 75 yards. Senior linebacker Zack Skarzynski (Hinsdale, Ill.) had 13 solo tackles on Saturday afternoon, two shy of the Jumbos' program record of 15 held by Mike Andrews (1998) and Mike Frisoli (1992). He finished the outing with 15 total tackles. Senior Adam Auerbach (Glen Rock, N.J.) kicked the 19th field goal of his career, connecting from 28 yards. He is two shy of the program record set by Chris Wild from 1988-91.

**Wesleyan**

Freshman RB LaDarius Drew (Mesquite, Texas) carried the ball 36 times for 146 yards (4.1 yards per carry) to pace the Cardinal rushing attack during a 7-6 loss at Hamilton on Saturday. Wesleyan finished the game with 242 rushing yards. Drew helped set up the Cardinals' lone score with three runs for a combined 20 yards during the 48-yard drive.
