Will Hanley (New Canaan, Conn.), a senior guard/forward for Bowdoin, was a unanimous selection for Player of the Year in Maine after leading the Association in both scoring and rebounding during the 2011-12 season. He averaged 18.4 points and 11.4 rebounds per outing for the Polar Bears, and put together 16 double-doubles on the year. Hanley scored more than 20 points on 10 occasions, including a season-best 32 points at Southern Maine. He also registered season marks of 4.0 assists (3rd in Maine) and a 1.8 assist-to-turnover ratio, 1.4 blocks (3rd) and 1.3 steals, all while shooting 57 percent from the field (2nd). A first team all-state performer last year, this signifies the third season Hanley has been honored by the MMBCWA.

Joe McCloskey (Howland, Maine), a first-year forward for UMaine Farmington, received the Rookie of the Year honor in Maine following a very start to his career in 2011-12. He finished the season with per game averages of 9.9 points and 7.1 rebounds, and connected on 47 percent of his shot attempts from the floor. McCloskey reached double figures 11 times in 19 contests during the year, which included a season-high 20 points in an overtime road victory against Colby-Sawyer.

Dick Meader, the UMaine Farmington head coach in his 19th season at the end of the bench, was voted Coach of the Year in Maine by his peers after guiding the Beavers to a 16-11 record during the 2011-12 campaign. Despite four early-season non-conference setbacks, UMF reeled off wins in its first seven North Atlantic Conference (NAC) matches, and completed the league slate at 14-4 – one game back of the co-leaders (3rd). With an appearance in the NAC semifinals, the year marked a seven-game turnaround from conference action in 2010-11 that was keyed by play on the defensive end. The Beavers topped the 10-team league as the leaders in defensive rebounding, blocks, fouls committed, and opponents' field goal percentage.
