Men's Soccer Player of the Week

Patrick Jackson, Bates

(Sophomore, Midfielder - Durham, N.H.)

Jackson factored into all three of Bates goals in a crucial 3-2 victory over Wesleyan that kept the Bobcats' postseason hopes alive. Jackson scored the first two goals of the game before assisting on what proved to be the game-winning goal. He leads his team in scoring this season with eight goals and two assists for 18 points.

Notes: The race to reach the **2008 NESCAC Men's Soccer Championship** is wide open. Only defending NESCAC and NCAA champion Middlebury has secured a home quarterfinal contest, as the Panthers earned the right to host after Tufts upended Wesleyan last Tuesday. Middlebury also has the top seed for the first time in postseason history since the Panthers hold tie-breakers over every team that could catch them. Six teams are vying for the final three quarterfinal home games. Bates, Tufts and Wesleyan are all fighting to keep pace with the rest of the conference. The NESCAC Men's Soccer Championship features an important change for 2008, as for the first time eight teams will qualify for the playoffs with the quarterfinals commencing on Sunday, Nov. 2...**Amherst** freshman forward Jae Heo (Changwon, South Korea) tallied the game-winning goal in the 57th minute to give the Lord Jeffs a 2-1 win over Williams on Saturday. It was his ninth goal of the season...**Bowdoin** freshman forward Eddie Jones (Scarborough, Maine) had a hand in all of the Polar Bears' scoring last week. Jones assisted on the lone Bowdoin goal in a 3-1 loss at Colby on Saturday before scoring the only Polar Bear tally in a 2-1 setback at Babson on Sunday...**Colby** senior midfielder Logan King (Hingham, Mass.) had a pair of goals during the Mules' 2-0 week, collecting a goal in each game...**Connecticut College** senior goalkeeper Ted Lane (Portland, Ore.) made five saves in a 1-1 draw with Middlebury, including a terrific diving stab with 3:27 remaining in the first overtime. Lane has made 254 saves in his collegiate career...**Middlebury** freshman forward Tyler Macnee (Williston, Vt.) netted two big goals for the Panthers last week. On Wednesday against Norwich, Macnee had the game-winner with 43 seconds remaining in double-overtime for a 2-1 Middlebury win. He scored the game-tying goal on Saturday in a 1-1 draw at Connecticut College...**Trinity** senior goalkeeper Zac Trudeau (Norwell, Mass.) made eight saves in Saturday's 1-0 overtime victory over Tufts...**Tufts** scored two goals less than four minutes apart to overcome a 1-0 deficit in a 2-1 win Tuesday evening against Wesleyan. Senior Peter DeGregorio (Whatley, Mass.), playing in his final home game, and junior Dan Schoening (Kenmore, Wash.) scored for the Jumbos in the victory.
