## Player of the Week: Jill Henrikson, Bowdoin (Sr. – Bath, ME)

Henrikson averaged 22.3 points, 7.6 rebounds, 1.3 assists and 1.6 steals per game in a 2-1 week for the Polar Bears. She had 25 points and nine rebounds in a 65-45 win against Eastern Connecticut. In a 68-58 win at Middlebury, Henrikson poured in 17 points to go along with four rebounds. The senior guard finished off the week with a 25 point effort in a loss at Williams. She also grabbed 10 rebounds and three steals. Henrikson shot 20-for-39 from the floor and 10-for-23 from beyond the arc, while knocking down 17 of her 19 free throws last week.

## Rookie of the Week: Molly Brown, Bates (Fy. - South Dartmouth, MA)

Brown averaged 13.0 points and 4.7 rebounds, 1.3 assists, 0.7 blocked shots and 1.0 steal per game for Bates this week. She scored 16 points against Trinity to go along with four rebounds, one block, and one steal. She shot 14-for-29 from the floor and made six threes in nine attempts (.667) in the three games.
