Women's Lacrosse Player of the Week

Jenn Brallier, Bates

(Sophomore, Attacker - Chambersburg, Pa.)

Brallier played a big part in the Bobcats' 2-0 road week - their first two wins of the season - as she scored seven goals, added an assist, and had six draw controls. At Babson on Tuesday, Brallier had three goals, three draw controls, and a ground ball as part of Bates' 12-7 victory. She followed on Saturday with a career-high four tallies along with an assist for a five-point outing and contributed three draw controls and one ground ball in a 10-7 win at Wesleyan.

Notes: Amherst sophomore midfielder Marta Randall (Monkton, Md.) recorded six goals and two assists during a 1-1 week for the Jeffs. Randall had three points in Wednesday's 9-7 overtime win at Connecticut College, with her final goal of the game serving as the game-winner. She had five points in Saturday's 9-8 setback to Bowdoin...Bowdoin sophomore attacker Carolyn Gorajek (Hightstown, N.J.) scored seven goals and assisted on two others in a 2-0 week for the Polar Bears. Gorajek had four goals, including the game-tying and game-winning goals with under 10 minutes to play, as Bowdoin came away with a 9-8 win over Amherst on Saturday...Colby junior midfielder Claire Donegan (Great Falls, Va.) had four goals and four assists in a 1-1 week for the Mules. Donegan netted three goals and three assists in Tuesday's 17-11 victory over Union. She contributed a goal, an assist, and four caused turnovers in Saturday's 11-9 setback to Trinity...Connecticut College junior midfielder Katelyn Driscoll (Peabody, Mass.) had seven goals, an assist, six caused turnovers, and three draw controls during an 0-2 week for the Camels. Senior Celia Medeiros collected 11 grounders for the defense over the two outings...Middlebury senior midfielder Sally Ryan (Mountain Lakes, N.J.) scored eight goals and assisted on a ninth in a 2-0 week for the Panthers. She also picked up 12 ground balls, had seven draw controls, caused 12 turnovers, and converted 4-of-4 free position shots. After tallying her 100th career goal against Babson earlier in the week, Ryan had five goals, six caused turnovers, and six draw controls in a 15-9 victory at Connecticut College on Saturday...Trinity senior attacker Rachel Romanowsky (Hampstead, N.H.) netted five goals and five assists in a 2-0 week for the Bantams. In Thursday's 12-8 win over Union, Romanowsky scored three goals and four assists... Tufts junior Lara Kozin (Suffern, N.Y.) had five goals and classmate Casey Egan (Massapegua, N.Y.) earned two goals and four assists in Saturday's 14-9 win over Williams... Wesleyan sophomore Kayla Ellman (Montclair, N.J.) had six goals during a 1-1 week for the Cardinals, scoring three goals in each game last week... Williams sophomore A/M Emily Whicker (Potomac, Md.) notched eight points with seven goals and an assist in a 1-1 week for the Ephs. During Tuesday's 9-8, come-from-behind win over Mary Washington, Whicker scored the game-winning goal with 2:19 to play in the second half.
