The prerequisites are listed after each course (101 is a prerequisite for all courses) and are Psychology courses unless otherwise specified. Any course that has an * by it is offered irregularly. Students must take one course from each of the 4 areas, plus 3 additional courses in their focus area (3 out of 4 in focus area must be at the 300 level.); and at least one outside of focus at the 300 level. Only one Short Term course may be counted toward the major; it must be from the list of courses in the student's area of focus. If numbered s10-s29, that Short Term course may count as the 200-level course in the area of focus. If numbered s30-s49, it may count as one of the 300-level courses in the area of focus. A maximum of 3 courses taken abroad or in summer can be counted for a psychology major: 1 may be statistics **OR** methods, but not both; courses must be preapproved. Note that 101, 218, and 261 or 262 must be completed by the end of the junior year.
